Praying for our Dead

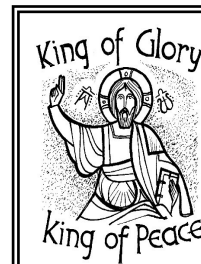

The Second Vatican Council saw renewed commitment to the Charism of Presentation's foundress Nano Nagle. Many communities like Mullingar were autonomous under the authority of the Bishop, following a process of discernment and prayer in 1975, Presentation Sisters worldwide amalgamated and are now known as the "Union of the Presentation Sisters." The first lay principals in Mullingar were Carmel Hickey appointed to the senior school in 1991 and Valerie Moore in the Junior school in 2000. The charism of venerable Nano Nagle endures among teachers and staff working with the children to grow to their full potential. The Sisters thank the people of Mullingar for their generosity to all Presentation Sisters down through the years and to their missions worldwide.
