Supreme Court judgement

Noting this week's decision of the Supreme Court, the
Bishops said:

"Every one of us has a right to our life. It is not given
to us by the *Constitution of Ireland* or by any law. We
have it 'as of right', whether we are wealthy or poor,
healthy or sick. All human beings have it. For us as a
society to now declare that any category of human
being should have that right taken from them would be
a shocking step. It effectively says that unborn
children do not exist or, if they do, they do not
count. That is a manifest injustice."

human being who almost missed out on a chance at
